"Ministry is meeting the needs of others with the resources of God." This is what John Wimber taught us as we first set out to explore the Gifts of the Spirit and how to use them to great effect, for the blessing and healing of others. We might do well to re-visit this most cardinal of Vineyard values.

CHURCH PLANTING

Steve is passionate about seeing people come to know Jesus and seeing churches planted. This session will look at and grapple with questions such as; "Why do we plant churches?", "How do churches get planted?" and "How do you explore the idea of church planting?" For the church to have a future, the next generation needs to take the baton and face the challenge that God is looking for future leaders of His church.

Steve, with his wife Juliet, leads the Leicester City Vineyard and heads up church planting for Vineyard Churches across the UK and Ireland.

THE VITALITY OF SMALL GROUPS

David & Alison Flowers - G4

Small groups are different from big groups. They reach the parts big groups can't reach. Healthy, vital, welcoming small groups are where people are changed and healed and find community. Many people around us are lonely and unsupported, small groups provide a lifeline to the living God. In this seminar David and Alison will share ideas on how to run an effective small group, how to release small group leaders and how to develop a culture of sharing life in small groups in your church.

David and Alison are Senior Pastors of the Wharfedale Vineyard and Area Leaders for the North. They have led many small groups, trained many small group leaders and would describe small groups as being the heart of their church.

YOU GET IT TO GIVE IT: RELEASING NEXT GENERATION LEADERS Fric Pickerill - F3

"You get it to give it" summarises one of our core Vineyard values. In this seminar we will discuss how to give it away to the next generation of leaders. We will talk not just about developing a vision for young leaders, but we'll get into the nuts and bolts of how to do it.

Before planting Vineyard Amsterdam in 2008, Eric Pickerill served on the senior pastoral team of the Columbus Vineyard where he pastored young adults in Joshua House, developed the internship programme, and coordinated the sending of over 20 church planters.

FORUM - FOR ASSOCIATE LEADERS LEADING FROM THE SECOND CHAIR Tom & Helen Murphy - F5

They say it's lonely at the top. It can be even lonelier when you are almost at the top. Church leaders who hold 'second chair' positions are under tremendous pressure. They are expected to do their jobs and provide leadership but defer to the top leader too. It's a demanding balancing act. How can they lead effectively while serving under someone else's leadership?

Tom and Helen have been second chair leaders in the Vineyard for over a decade now and they are keen to meet other second chair leaders.
